- The program is committed to creating 'knowledgeable athletes' in all aspects of Wake Boarding.
- Team members will gain the rewards of 'learning side-by-side' with Saskatchewan top course conductors and instructors for 3 - 5 day camps.
(Blocking of Program days will maximize the SWSA's abilities to gain medals at the Nationals).

Criterion for Athlete Selection

- 26 yrs of age max.
- Saskatchewan resident for 1 year.
- Commitment to team
